Two fined for holding illegal meat

Two Ratanakkiri men were reprimanded and fined late last week after a joint operation uncovered six mountain tortoises and more than 60 kilograms of illegal wildlife meat in their possession.

The 66-kilogram haul came from a cornucopia of illicit species, including wild boar, flying squirrel, porcupine, red deer, tortoises, black soft-shell turtles

The six mountain tortoises, weighing 14 kilos, were released into the forest.

nphat district Forestry Administration, working together with the NGO Alliance and other authorities, arrested the pair in Laban Siek ne, Banlung district on Thursday. Lumphat Forestry Administration Sophan said the meat had been buried in the forest and declined to ie two men, who will not face charges.
